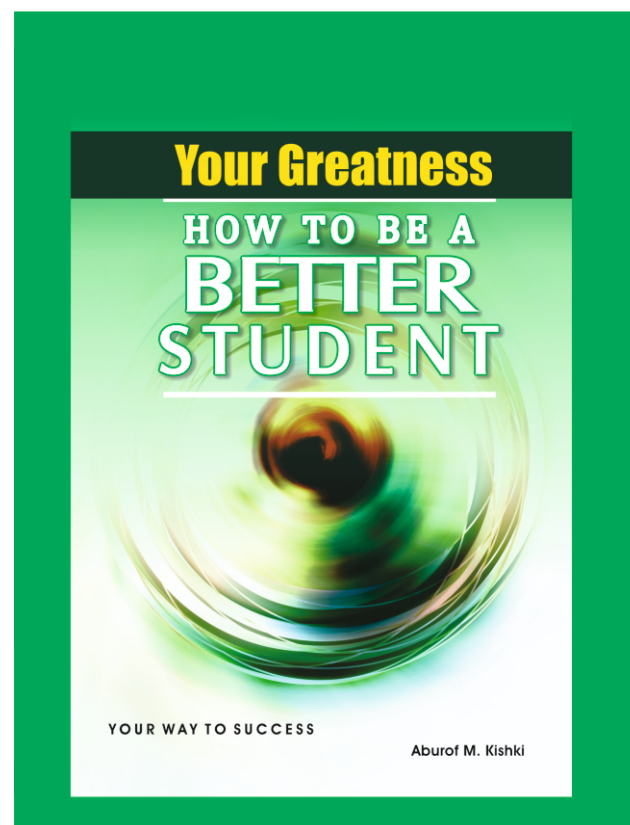
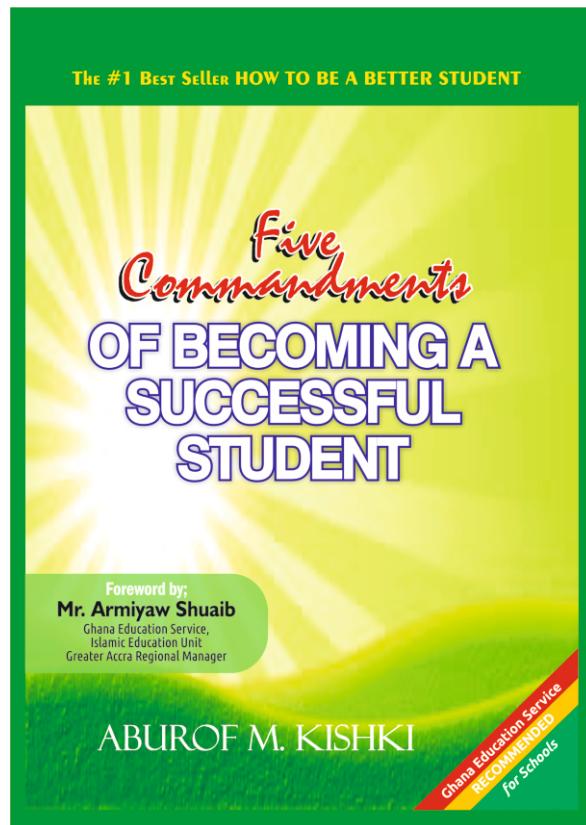

The Ghanaian Dream Project is an innovative, educative and motivational programme which provides interactive platforms to educate, orient, and motivate the youth and students of Ghana to develop a positive mental attitude, a sense of purpose, responsibility, values, giving back to society and to cherish the values of patriotism. The target group for the programme includes students in junior, senior and tertiary institutions, as well as youth organizations.

From 1st November to 30th November, 2016... our Ghanaian Dream Motivational Show was in in the Upper West region of Ghana and we visited nine (9) Senior High Schools with the theme “Protecting Ghana through Excellence”. Free and fair election 2016. These schools were:

ST Francis Girls' Senior High School, Lassia-Tuolu Senior High School, Wa Senior High School, Takpo Senior High School, Tupaso Technical Institute, I.T Amass Senior High School, St Francis Xavier Senior High School, Wa Technical Institute, Wa Sec/Tec High school.

The sessions in these schools were life touching, and during each session, the Upper West Regional Coordinator of the project, introduced the project and its importance to the students hence opening the program with a poetry performance by Pobee, the Poet, the finest poet in the region. The key note speaker, Mr. Aburol M. Kishki, the Executive Director of the Foundation took the students through the “Five commandments of becoming a successful student” and ended it with a call to the students to be ambassadors of peace and should not resort to violence in this election 2016. The responses from these schools were great and very emotional, considering the feedback from some of the students and teachers.

It really showed how students needed this kind of extra curricula activity. Over 12,000 students participated in the programme.

A total number of 187 post evaluation questionnaires were administered throughout the participatory schools, which included both the teachers and students, aimed at finding out how the GDP is impacting the participants and how they are buying into the concept of the project.

The students' forms provided were 180 and the teachers' forms 7. However, out of these survey forms provided, a total of 160 questionnaires with responses were submitted to the GDP team. Hence, 20 questionnaires were not accounted for. It is assumed that, these participants' forms were never completed; participants failed to submit them after the programme or the questionnaires were misplaced. The questionnaire looked at rating of the programme, what they learnt from the programme and its future prospects, asking students if they would like to be part of the project again. All the 104 students who participated in the evaluation process answered in the affirmative; they would be glad to be part of the programme in their school again. And 145 out of 160 rated the programme excellent, 10 rated it good and 5 rated it fair.

For the teachers, only 6 forms were submitted back to the GDP team. 1 was not accounted for and in 2 schools, there wasn't any school authority to help hold the session, but those schools were the best schools in the project. The teachers' questionnaire was intended to have a reasonable open approach, thus giving respondents the opportunity to express in a narrative form, their personal reflections. Some brief background information was also asked. Generally, the teachers' participation was very great in most of the school and their responses were very satisfactory.
